




floorplan herbal institute - M.1:200



polygramm - village structure - no scale


Location

The project is located in Letea, a small village in the northwestern part of the Danube Delta in Romania. The region is characterized by its rugged, wild, and isolated landscape, marked by sandy soils and a harsh way of life. Living in Letea requires careful decisions and a strong sense of belonging, which only the true inhabitants of the Danube Delta with their deep-rooted traditions and values possess. Approximately 1000 people live in Letea, who are closely connected and primarily engaged in agriculture, fishing, and the preservation of ancient traditions.


The village of Letea is linearly structured, consisting of two main streets along which the buildings are arranged like pearls on a string. These two main residential streets are the vibrant heart of the village, where daily life unfolds. Here, one can find two supermarkets, a hotel, a school, and two restaurants. The main streets run parallel to the adjacent Danube. Cross streets connecting Letea to the Danube run through the village at regular intervals, further structuring it. Notably, almost every building has a front yard where agriculture for self-sufficiency is practiced, adding lateral green strips that further soften the village's structure.

These small-scale green strips for self-sufficiency decrease towards the east, downstream, and eventually merge into general cultivation areas and wasteland. A distinctive feature in the eastern belt of loosely placed buildings, providing the village with a naturally grown, light boundary. These buildings are slightly larger and recognized as agricultural structures. In this outer belt, the new project of the Popa family is to be established. With their traditional knowledge, the Popa family aims to create added value for the village and its residents as well as for outsiders. At the same time, the project aims to generate an economic source of income that is connected to the village and in harmony with the surroundings.

The Popa family's initiative aims to preserve and utilize the traditional values and knowledge of the villagers to promote sustainable development opportunities. By creating sources of income that align with the local environment, the project intends to strengthen the village community and maintain the cultural identity of Letea.
